Introduction and application of the Schulwerk approach through voice, body and instrumental explorations for primary children through a collaborative model. Skill development of the soprano recorder. Elemental principles in improvisation, composition and arranging of pentatonic scales and simple ostinati in duple and triple meters. Creative dance pedagogy, body percussion and drama as they apply to the Schulwerk. Focus on speech, chants, songs and rhymes to playfully explore the elements of music. Course includes training in BrainDance.

Prerequisite: An understanding of basic music fundamentals and notation. A desire to learn and willingness to playfully collaborate with others!

Kerri Lynn Nichols has taught Orff Pre-K-College for 23 years in the public and private sectors. A prolific children's composer, author and recording artist, she teaches courses across the country and abroad in music and movement. Her work includes inservices for schools, assemblies, music/dance integration with academics and choreography for dance companies. She received her Orff certification from the University of Memphis and completed the International Course at the Orff-Institut in Salzburg, Austria. Kerri Lynn is certified in creative movement through the Summer Dance Institute (Seattle) where she is a guest instructor. She regularly collaborates with youth to create summer drama and dance camps which focus on global themes and inclusion. An imaginative, playful and inspiring teacher, she nurtures students to connect with music from the inside out. She currently directs The Rhythm of Life and Songlight Children's Choir in Olympia.

Clare Bourquein is a professional musician and public school music educator having utilized the Orff approach in her classroom for 20 years. She has studied Orff at the University of Cincinnati and Mills College and Dalcroze-Eurhythmics at Ohio State University. Currently, she is President of the Portland Orff Schulwerk Association (OR) and spends free time composing music for children, performing with Pacific Crest Wind Symphony on clarinet and Wild Rose Garland Dance on recorder, teaching private piano lessons and singing in Fourtissimo, a women's quartet. Clare sparkles in front of children and loves to experience the creative process of making music.
